Ani Gogova's "masterful poetic expression", "ravishing colors" and "virtuoso technique beyond reproach" have been captivating audiences around the world for the last two decades. Her career started early in her native Bulgaria when she won all major competitions. Gogova came to the US to complete her Doctorate of Musical Arts at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor and has made her home in Chicago since 2003 when she was appointed at the Chicago College of Performing Arts at Roosevelt University—the youngest professor to join the world -renowned faculty of the Music Conservatory.

Named by the press "one of the most versatile and innovative musicians of his generation",

Ian Maksin is quickly gaining international recognition as a cellist, composer and most recently as a film producer. Born in Saint-Petersburg, Russia, Maksin started playing the cello at age six. He has performed at concert halls throughout the world as a soloist, chamber musician as well as the principal cellist of the New World Symphony. Ian describes his main goal as an artist is "to close the musical gap between generations and societies and make cello music accessible for everyone".
