## FROM THE ARCHIVES

# Liz Walloch, Historian/Archivist

Writing a monthly article from our Chapter's 100 years history can be overwhelming because the topic choices are limitless. Searching through materials for this month's article, I selected some interesting pen worthy finds for sharing.

# The Archives presents "The Month of February"

This excerpt on the year 1923 comes from Alice Leisman's PipeNotes article of August 1984. Alice shared two February dates from Chapter records describing ongoing activities.

#### February 12, 1923

It was reported that members whose dues were paid promptly would receive "New Music Review" as the official Guild magazine. A motion was passed to draft a local constitution and by-laws modeled on the national constitution and by-laws. There was a discussion on bringing a concert organist to Milwaukee for a recital at Grand Avenue Congregational Church. Charles Corboin could be secured for \$150.00 and Marcel Dupre for \$400.00.

#### February 18, 1923

A new member of the Chapter, Earl Morgan, gave an organ recital under the auspices of the Guild at St. Paul's Episcopal Church. His program included:

Grand Piece Symphonique – Franck Scherzo in E Major – Gigout Shepherd's Song – Jacob Chant Pastoral – Dubois Romance san Paroles – Bonnet Pastorale (Symphony I) – Vierne Allegro Vivace (Symphony V) – Widor

For those wondering if the Chapter followed through with either the Corboin or Dupre concert, the answer is yes. The chapter hosted Charles Corboin recital on April 17, 1923 and netted a profit of \$350.00 from the event.

Pipe Notes from January 1957 and The Milwaukee Chapter Yearbook and Directory of 1956-1957 takes us to Emmaus Lutheran Church on North 23<sup>rd</sup> Street at W. Hadley. There was a 4 o'clock recital scheduled on February 10 for chapter members to hear The University of Michigan's truly great organist of our generation, Robert Noehren. His program included composer's works of J.S. Bach, Cesar Franck, Louis Vierne, Paul de Maleingreau, a Noehren piece entitled "Fugue," Sigfrid Karg-Elert and Oliver Messiasn. Following the recital at 6 pm, there was a dinner served by the Ladies of Emmaus Church.

On February 13, 1966 the chapter offered a different type of recital, "A Lecture Recital" featuring Dr. Robert Rayfield on the topic of "Authenticity in Registration." Dr. Rayfield's lecture recital was a slight twist as this event served as their February meeting. "The Milwaukee Chapter is honored and we feel very fortunate to have scheduled Dr. Robert Rayfield for our February meeting." A few highlights from this 4 pm program at Our Savior's Lutheran Church. "This program has been acclaimed as one of the most outstanding and valuable presentations ever prepared for organists. Specifications for organs associated with the composers represented on the program were distributed to the audience" along with the organ specification for Our Savior's Church. Dr. Rayfield demonstrated "authentic tone that the composers might have used in playing their compositions." The cost for members to attend this event was \$3.00 and \$1.50 for students.

Here is a fundraiser notice that we all could contribute to today and support. Did anyone say Rummage Sale? From PipeNotes December 1983 the Chapter would be holding an AGO Rummage Sale: Fun and Bargains on Friday evening of February 10, 1984 before the Skills and Resources Evening. There was a call out for "any worthy but no-longer-used organ music in the back of your files? Any organ records you haven't played for five years? Any 20-year issues of The Diapason, Music Magazine, The American Organist, etc., gathering dust in your attic? The Milwaukee Chapter would be receiving all the profits from the fundraiser."

Linked with the musical rummage sale on the same evening was the Skills and Resources Seminars. The evening offered three free to members programs starting off was the "Twentieth-Century German Organ Music" led by Dr. Karen Albers. Dr. Albers presented "background on styles and composers, and several AGO members performed music from this school of composition." The second program was led by Edward Wise, teacher of organ and voice at the Wisconsin Conservatory of Music and music director at Mount Zion Lutheran Church, the location of the evening's event. Mr. Wise presented on Choral Techniques for Organists who have not had much training in vocal and conducting techniques. To wrap up the evening, Alice Leisman led a panel discussion on "The AGO Exams: We Did It, and You Can Too!" The panel consisted of members who have recently passed one of the AGO Exams from Service Playing to FAGO. Tips, background info and encouragement were given to whose present who might be considering studying for one of the exams.

The what I shared in this article is a small sampling of the Chapter's dedicated efforts to promote organ and choral music through recitals and fellowship. For a deeper look, spend some time searching through the online Archives on the webpage. As I said in the beginning, the topic choices are limitless. By exploring our history's legacy, giving ideas a refreshed look, and using all the resources at our finger tips, the Chapter has endless possibilities for programming events for another 100 years and beyond.

Sharing one last February date, February 21, 2023. This Tuesday before Ash Wednesday has been called by many names of Mardi Gras, Shrove Tuesday, Paczki Day, Fat Tuesday, Pancake Day. By whatever name you call it, enjoy!
