Happy New Year and Happy Semi-Supercentenarian in 2024!! I know you are saying "what?" Our chapter qualifies for this distinctive title this year as we celebrate our 105<sup>th</sup> year. The added bonus of this title is we retain this title with honor through our 109<sup>th</sup> year. At our 110<sup>th</sup> year, there is yet another special title for our chapter to celebrate.

As I thought of what to share from the Archives this New Year, two words came into my thoughts "fresh" and "refresh." Both words suggest a variety of meanings in different usages, however, in the context of our chapter here is my short list of meanings. "Fresh" and Refresh" describe a new energy, untapped possibilities, newness, a restorative point of view, beginning anew, being revived, and ready to engage. I myself heard these two words a lot in 2023 as I embarked on a master bathroom remodel. That's what I called it, a remodel project. However, the designers and consultants referred to the project as a "refresh." As the chapter continues to carry forward into our 105<sup>th</sup> year, I know programming chapter events have journeyed many different paths. Some ideas brought to the Executive Board were a sure fit at the right time, others were discussed and tabled for a few years down the road. Still others were discussed and tabled for a variety of reasons. What the Archives offers is a "treasure trove" of ideas for a "fresh" and "refresh" look for programming events small and large. Granted, I have been in the online Archives quite a bit and have circulated through the paper materials viewing the materials from a variety of different lenses. Sometimes I am searching for information to clarify, other times I am searching and learning unique facts about our chapter. When I read through the early years of the chapter, there is a determination, a commitment of members involvement in the many different subcommittees besides the Executive Board. Could I attract you members in 2024 to a "fresh" and a "refresh" exploration of the online Archives and learn the rich heritage that has brought us to this time, our 105<sup>th</sup> year? If you do not know where to start, here are two starting points to consider. Log into the Archives and start with viewing PipeNotes from the beginning in 1954. You don't have to read them like a novel, but scan through them. Something will catch your interest; make you pause and call to you to read through. You will pick up a connection and it will draw you to view more. Also, the early Chapter Yearbooks are a wealth of information of the teamwork by the chapter. With all our advanced technology today, viewing the penned word on paper, the use of the manual typewriter for correspondence, meeting minutes and PipeNotes, the telephone chains to communicate news with members, snail mail, and the social gatherings for the pure enjoyment of sharing our interest in organ music, seems light years ago. The digitized paper materials make our history accessible, and this has made the heartbeat of our chapter stronger today. It's our past that has carried the chapter forward using all the technologies possible. My trifecta wish for programming future events includes a "fresh" look at the "refreshed" MATC Skinner organ and a Giant Music Repurpose Event, aka Music Rummage Sale, and a few casual stop ins for coffee/tea events with members at one of the local coffee shops for sharing and networking. Could exploring the online Archives be one of your New Year's resolutions to connect the chapter's past with the present and its future? From the Archive corner, I would wholeheartedly agree it will be worth your effort and time.
